What can Ecclesiastes do for me?

The Purpose of Ecclesiastes is: To spare future generations the bitterness of learning through their own experiences that life is meaningless apart from God.

The setting of Ecclesiastes is: Solomon was looking back on his life, much of which was lived apart from God.

From our culture we hear:

- <u>Possessions</u> are what will give you meaning and satisfaction.
- **Experience** it for your self that is when you are happy and satisfied.
- <u>Power</u> is satisfying.
- Pleasure that is what you want.
- Solomon found these to be a disappointment and disillusionment.

Hear the Truth:

- <u>Humility</u> is the attitude Solomon came to at the end of his life.
- <u>Repentance</u> was the result of his looking back on his life.
- Solomon affirms the value of knowledge, relationships, work, and pleasure, but only in their proper place. Everything temporal must be seen in light of the eternal.

Looking Back; Let us take an Inventory of our lives, learning from our mistakes, confessing them to God and asking His power to not repeat them. Let us read and learn from Solomon's wisdom and folly.
